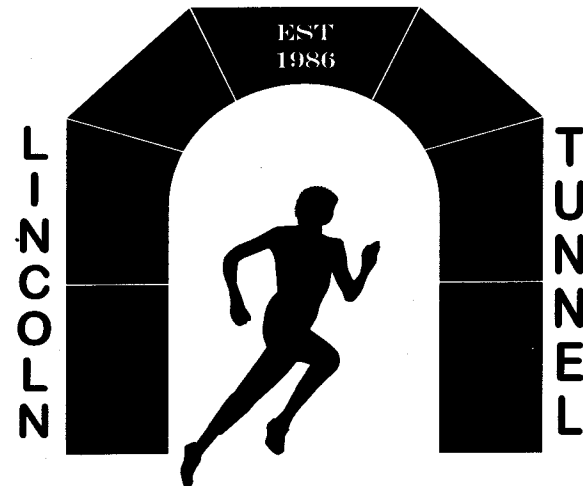

The Facts



In 1986, Chris Pisano got involved in Special Olympics. It gave him a passion for life. Now he runs four miles a day, sometimes alone and sometimes with others. In 1999, he ran a marathon in the Special Olympics World Summer Games.

Chris is one of over 13,000 Special Olympics athletes in New Jersey. Annually, over 140 competitive events are held in more than 300 communities throughout the Garden State. Through their participation, these athletes develop team-working skills and gain self-confidence, an important step towards their transition into their communities.

This year, new initiatives are designed to provide a more expansive and higher quality program for a greater number of athletes. Together with the support of sponsors and volunteers, we *can* inspire greatness for more athletes than ever before.

The Tunnel

Yes, it is healthy and safe to run/walk underwater! The South Tube (also the newest tube) of the Lincoln Tunnel is washed and the roadway is degreased the night prior to the run. The air is changed every 90 seconds with air originating high above the Hudson River, which makes the air quality inside the tunnel better than the air quality outside! The tunnel is ventilated constantly and no vehicles are allowed in the tunnel until after the run is completed.

The Event

The 15th Annual Lincoln Tunnel Challenge

Sunday, April 29, 2001
Run starts at 9:00 AM
Check-in starts 7:00 AM

Staging Area

Located in the NJ Transit Bus parking lot adjacent to the Lincoln Tunnel Administration Building, 500 Boulevard East, Weehawken.

Course

5K (3.1 miles) through the Lincoln Tunnel and back. (USATF Certified)
No rollerblades, bicycles, skateboards or pets allowed.

Individual Registration

**\$12 pre-entry fee postmarked by
April 13**

\$15 entry fee postmarked after April 13 and on-site.

Team Registration

To be eligible for Team Awards: Must have a minimum of three (unlimited maximum).
No additional fee.

All Team members' registrations must be sent in one envelope and postmarked by April 13.

**No on-site team registration.
No on-site team changes.**

Check-In

Arrive between 7:00 AM and 8:30 AM the morning of the race for number and T-shirt pick-up at the staging area.

Free Parking & Shuttle Bus

Parking on day of run at staging area in NJ. Shuttle bus from NY's 41st Street between 8th & 9th Avenues (at whale mural)
From NY: 7:00 AM, 7:30 AM, 8:00 AM
Return to NY: starting at 10:00 AM

All running awards will be presented following the race.
You must be present to win awards and prizes.
